Nando's sign for Bell Court

Nando's is the latest big name to join the £30 million Bell Court development.

The popular restaurant chain has signed a 15-year lease and will occupy a 2,500sq.ft. unit overlooking the central courtyard at the development, as well as extra outdoor seating.

Nando's is joining a range of other restaurants, including Byron, Miller & Carter and All Bar One. It's unit will be handed over for fit out in the next few months, with the restaurant hoping to open in June.

The announcement comes just a week after news that the cinema unit has been handed over to Everyman, with the aim of opening in June.

John Stacey, Asset Management Director at UK & European Investments, said: "Securing the right mix of tenants is key to ensuring the long term success of Bell Court."

"Popular brands such as Nando's are a fantastic addition to the scheme, perfectly complimenting the operator line-up that we have already secured. We are delighted to have them join us at Bell Court and I'm sure that a lot of local residents will be very excited by this announcement."

Bardwatch & Warwickshire Retail Crime Initiative

The relaunch of Bardwatch for night time and day time economy took place yesterday (14th March). Stratforward is moving back to the Warwickshire Retail Crime Initiative which is now based online and continues to be supported by Warwickshire Police. Mike Cornes, the WRCI co-ordinator outlined how the system will work, the ease of use (it is accessible from phones, tablets & computers) and the significant benefits to businesses of working together.

The system will allow stores and pubs to identify offenders, ban prolific offenders from member premises, and ensure that Stratford town centre is a safe place to visit, work and do business. Stratforward will also be using the WRCI system to record incidents related to busking and begging.

Shakespeare Set to Bring Surge to Stratford


Join the national celebration

Stratford is under the spotlight again this week, with Shakespeare Week bringing a surge of school visits and families with it.

The annual celebration of the bard's creative legacy by primary schools across the country returns on Monday, running until Sunday, March 26th.

The nationwide event was established by the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust in 2014 and last year more than 1.9 million children in 12,000 primary schools across the UK took part.

The Birthplace Trust is hoping for as many to take part this year and on Friday (March 24th) will be welcoming youngsters from 15 schools across the county to its Warwickshire Schools Open **Day in collaboration with the RSC, Shakespeare's Schoolroom and Guildhall, Holy Trinity Church** and the Orchestra of the Swan.



A spokeswoman for the Trust said primary school bookings have gone up significantly since Shakespeare Week launched and the event is often cited as a reason by families for their visit to Stratford - even if not necessarily during the week itself.

Shakespeare Week 2017 provides teachers, home educators and families with free resources and ideas to teach Shakespeare across all subjects in the national curriculum including numeracy, geography, and computing.

This year's event, which has a music

theme, kicks off with the Big Shakespeare Assembly, featuring a brand new song 'Shakespeare Rocks!' especially composed for the occasion.

Shakespeare Week is also going digital with Mission Shakespeare, a free online interactive challenge developed in partnership with Coventry University and DigitalMe that allows children to earn digital badges by completing act ivities and games at home.

Plenty of other activities will be on offer as part of Shakespeare Week.
